### WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

Doceri is an app with two lives. It can be used to create illustrated or annotated presentations with your iPad in the style of the Khan Academy. The videos can be posted online, allowing you to "flip" your lecture - placing the core information-transfer materials online for student review prior to class and freeing up valuable class time for deeper dives on the topic and more active learning modalities.

Doceri can also be used to wirelessly control and annotate PowerPoint or Keynote presentations on any computer where Doceri Desktop is installed. Instructors are free to walk around the classroom and engage with students while still maintaining control of their presentations.

The Doceri workshop spans two sessions. The first hands-on workshop is December 10th, 2013, and will introduce you to Doceri as a remote control for presentations. The second workshop (in February 2014) will address how to use Doceri to create presentations for a flipped classroom.

After completing both workshops participants will be able to:

- ⇒ Compose, record, and post a lecture created in Doceri
- ⇒ Use Doceri to control a PowerPoint lecture including advancing slides, annotating on top of slides, and creating a PDF of all annotations for distribution to students.
- ⇒ Device/App Requirements: Participants must bring an iPad, 2nd generation or newer, to participate in this workshop. 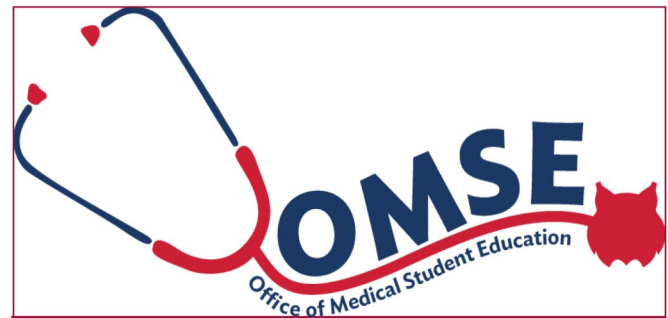
